PROJECT SUMMARY

After extensive surveying of various communities, we discovered a community named Bulugana, in Buyende district. Upon surveying this community, we discovered an impoverished community without a clean water source. This community has been surviving by accessing a nearby swamp that was being accessed by livestock and humans which is unsafe for human consumption.

After a geophysical survey, we determined 3 potential sites and we landed upon this precise location due to it was the only location purely located in the Bulugana village and the community's preferred location.

With a large drilling rig, we were able to drill to 52 m (171ft) and have successfully tapped into clean water (verified by the Ministry of water in Uganda). We created a unique fence design with the help of our beneficiaries for the unique souls.

COMMUNITY BACKGROUND

Primary Income Source / Employment status:

90% of the households rely on subsistence farming (where households grow food for only household consumption but sells the small surplus to afford basic needs like soap)

Next Nearest Water Source:

There is a communal, hand dug, shallow well (not clean water) that is 1 km (0.62 miles) away from homesteads. There is also a nearby swamp, approximately 1km from the center of the village. This swamp is shared by humans & animals which makes the water unclean and safe.

Description of area that the Borehole is located:

Bunyiza Taala borehole is located on community land donated by a community member. The source is strategically located enabling all households to easily access the clean water.
